If current trends continue, in 2050, still nearly 500 million people will have received **no education** at all

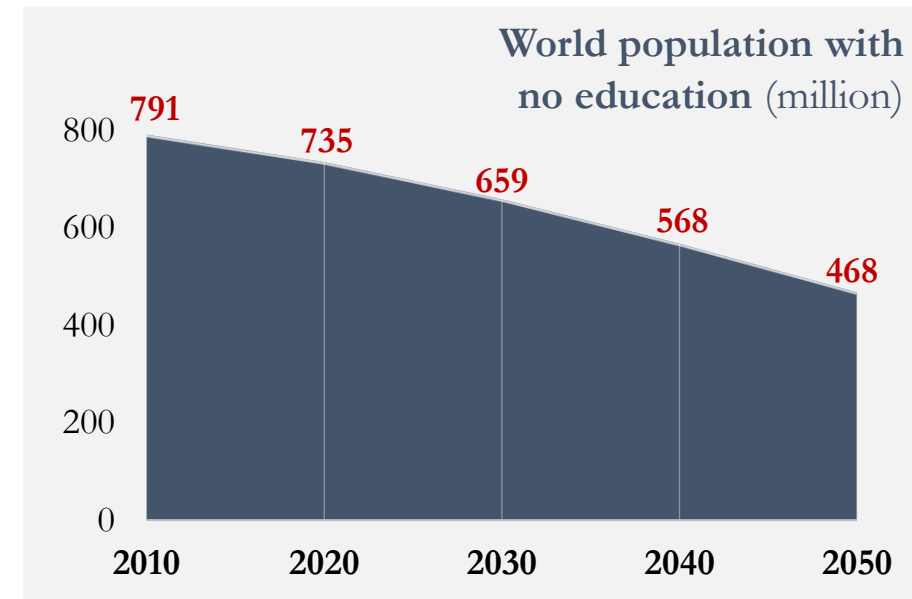

Achieving **universal secondary education**, in particular for **girls**, would lift 420 million people out of poverty, reducing extreme poverty by more than half

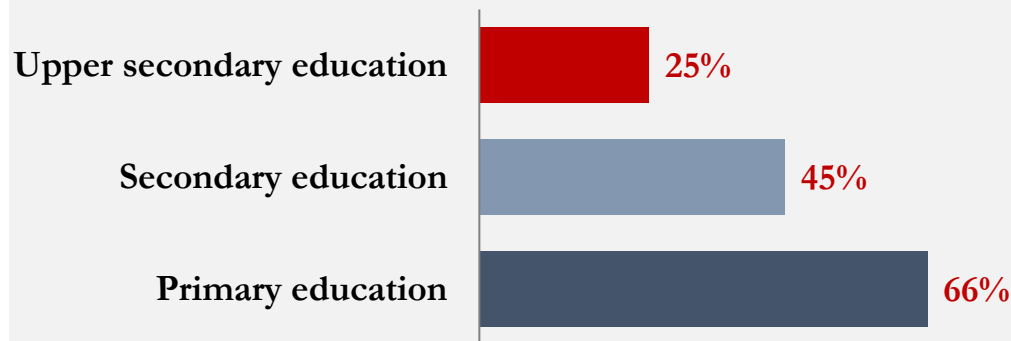
The **literacy rate** will increase globally, to reach **88% in 2050**, from **21% in 1900**

The **geographical divide will remain**: while high income countries should have achieved universal primary education before 2030, it will not be before **2088 for low-income countries**

The shortage of secondary teachers is estimated at **44.4 million teachers**. By 2030, only **29%** of youth will have access to **secondary education** in low-income countries



Share of countries that have achieved gender parity in education by level



Girls are **60% more likely** than boys to be educationally deprived

132 million girls are currently out of school (1 girl out of 6)

In Sub-Saharan Africa, providing all women with secondary education would **save the lives of 1.8 million children every year**
