If current trends continue, up to 5 billion people will still be unable to access health care in 2030.

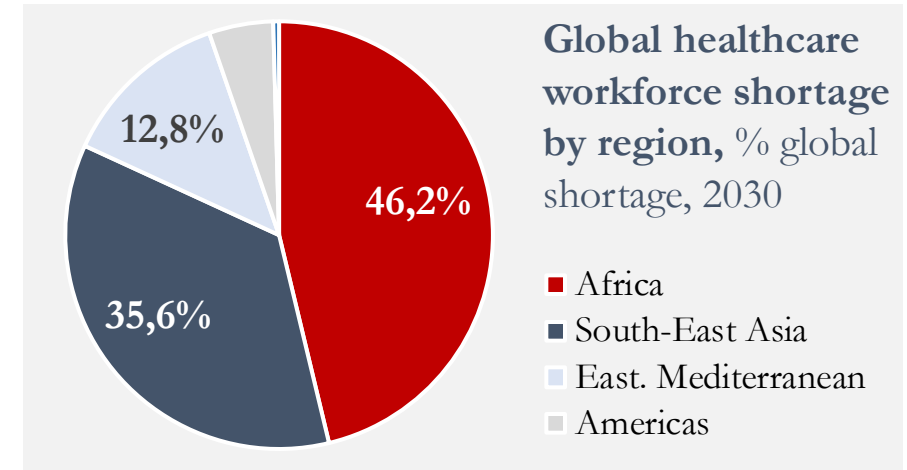
13 Million

By 2030, the world is expected to face a shortage of more than 13 Million healthcare workers.

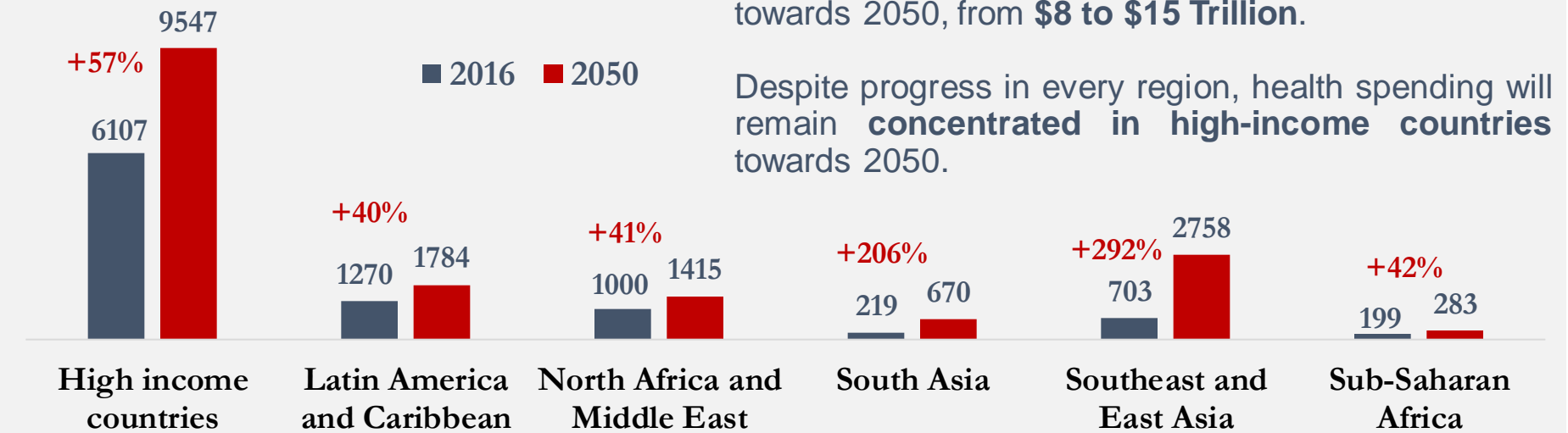
Today, more than **50% of the population** does not have access to essential health services.

A quarter of WHO member States have **less than 3 medical doctors per 10,000 people**.

By 2030, **Africa** will represent **half of the healthcare workforce shortage**, representing a deficit of more than 6 Million workers.
